


Where do I find entry and exit criteria in Jalapeno?

Entry/exit criteria are conditions, applied to value stream stages. Conditions may be added directly from the Value Stream Stage or Conditions can be accessed within the Business Analysis module of Jalapeno.

After selecting the “Business Rules” menu item make sure that you are in the ‘Condition’ tab.

How do I add conditions to the condition tree?

Adding from the value stream stage: click on ‘Add item’ in the entry/exit criteria and select the  button to add a new condition.

How do I add additional dimensions to each condition?

When you click on a selected condition within the Condition tree, navigate to the ‘Model’ sub-tab.

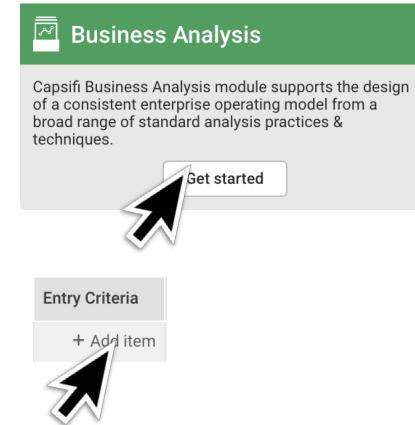
Here you will find a variety of properties that can be associated with the Condition. You can align the condition to other areas of Jalapeno that have already been modelled.

What are the essential parts of a condition that need to be modelled?

There is very little in Jalapeno that is mandatory. You may model as little or as much as is needed. However, for your condition to appear within the relevant value stream the condition must be aligned to the value stream stage that the condition applies to. You may come back and align conditions later if you do not already have this information modelled in your Jalapeno model.
